Minutes of the Management Committee meeting held on Thursday 25th September 2025 via Zoom, commencing at 7:30pm.

1. Apologies for absence: Duncan Brown, David Baxter, Richard Wenban, Melissa Rowley & Alex Spillett

Present: Carolyn Edwins (Chair), Alan Creegen, Mark Toulson, Jamie Finley, Peter Shillinglaw & Tim Edwins

2. Matters arising from the previous meeting:

10 teams attended the KPL Division 2 & Below Doubles competition.

3. Treasurer's report:

David absent so item carried forward to next meeting.

4. AGM Call & venue:

David was checking if GRFC can host the AGM. Tim will confirm with David when he is back from holiday and then prepare and distribute the AGM call document.

5. International grants:

Tim read an email from David saying we will need to use some reserves for grants this year, but players shouldn't be denied grants due to lots of Kent players being successful. If this level of success continues then we may need to look at budgeting differently next year. It was proposed to support international players with £125 each tournament and Meadow PC with £500 towards their EuroCup final costs. All present agreed.

6. Inter Regionals 2025:

Carolyn presented some feedback on each squad:

Championship – A very strong squad performance on Saturday winning 6/7 rounds. Lost the last round 3-5 to Chiltern which left us 1 game ahead overnight. On Sunday we won the first 4 rounds but

Chiltern had clawed back the 1 game advantage, and it was all square heading into the final round. The squad produced a stunning 6-2 win against Chiltern to win the Championship by 4 games. Kent 2 were the best overall team of the tournament.
